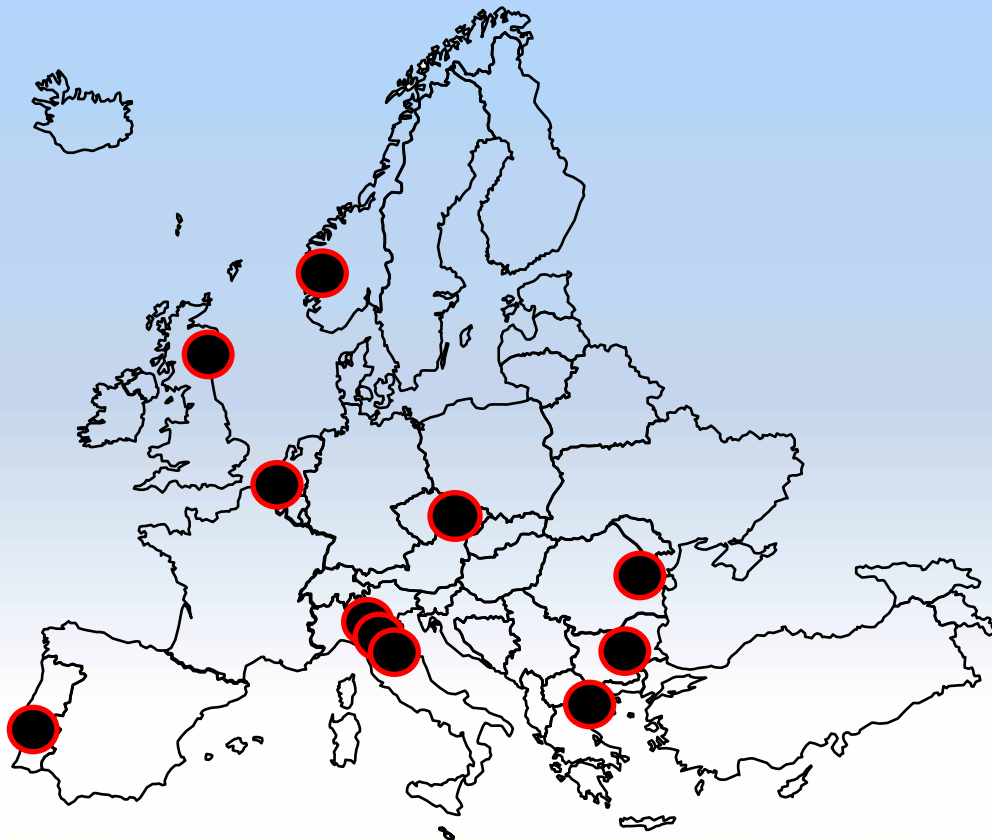

EPTA Main Background

European model for Public Transport Authority as a key factor leading to transport sustainability

- 7 key functions

Regulate, Plan, Tender/Award, Integrate, Promote, Manage, Control

- Hypothesis

7 functions concentrated in a single body supporting policy makers and relevant stakeholders

- Good practices across Europe will be transferred into regional development policies, to produce a MODEL for PTA
